Purpose: The document is intended for use by end-of-life recyclers or treatment facilities. It provides the basic instructions for the disassembly of HP products to remove components and materials requiring selective treatment, as defined by EU directive 2002/96/EC, Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE).

1.0 Items Requiring Selective Treatment

1.1 Items listed below are classified as requiring selective treatment.

3.0 Product Disassembly Process

3.1 List the basic steps that should typically be followed to remove components and materials requiring selective treatment:

1. Unscrew the screws on mounting angle 2, and then remove mounting angle 2 from the chassis.
2. Unscrew the screws on front panel 3, and then remove front panel 3 from the chassis.
3. Unscrew the screws on front panel 4, and then remove front panel 4 from the chassis.
4. Unscrew the screws on front panel 5, and then remove front panel 5 from the chassis.
5. Unscrew the screws on front panel 6, and then remove front panel 6 from the chassis.
6. Unscrew the screws on plastic panel 7, and then remove plastic panel 7 from the chassis.
7. Remove plastic panel 8 from the chassis.
8. Remove plastic panel 9 from the chassis.
9. Remove plastic panel 10 from the chassis.
10. Unscrew the screws on cable management bracket 11, and then remove cable management bracket 11 from the chassis.
11. Remove film 12 from the chassis.
12. Remove PSU 13 from the chassis.
13. Unscrew the screws on PMU 14, and then remove PMU 14 from the chassis.
14. Unscrew the screws on power cable holder 17, and then remove power cable holder 17 from the chassis.
15. Unscrew the screws on PEM 18, and then remove PEM 18 from the chassis.
16. Unscrew the screws on panel 15, and then remove panel 15 from the chassis.
17. Unscrew the screws on rear cover 19, and then remove rear cover 19 from the chassis.
18. Unscrew the screws on fan tray 20, and then remove fan tray 20 from the chassis.
19. Unscrew the screws on panel 21, and then remove panel 21 from the chassis.
20. Unscrew the screws on panel 22, and then remove panel 22 from the chassis.
21. Unscrew the screws on panel 23, and then remove panel 23 from the chassis.
22. Unscrew the screws on part 24, and then remove part 24 from the chassis.
23. Unscrew the screws on part 25, and then remove part 25 from the chassis.
24. Unscrew the screws on part 26, and then remove part 26 from the chassis.
25. Unscrew the screws on part 27, and then remove part 27 from the chassis.
26. Unscrew the screws on part 28, and then remove part 28 from the chassis.
27. Unscrew the screws on part 29, and then remove part 29 from the chassis.
28. Remove all of the inner cables from the chassis.
29. Unscrew the screws on backboard 30, and then remove backboard 30 from the chassis.
30. Unscrew the screws on power shelf 16, and then remove power shelf 16 from the chassis.
31. Remove all of the EMI fingers from the chassis.
32. Unscrew the screws on PCB 3-1, and then remove PCB 3-1 from the front panel 3.
33. Unscrew the screws on PCB 3-2, and then remove PCB 3-2 from the front panel 3.
34. Unscrew the screws on PCB 3-3, and then remove PCB 3-3 from the front panel 3.
35. Remove hole plug 3-4 from the front panel 3.
36. Remove film 3-5 from the front panel 3.

37. Remove EMI finger 3-6 from the front panel 3.
38. Unscrew the screws on PCB 4-1, and then remove PCB 4-1 from the front panel 4.
39. Unscrew the screws on PCB 4-2, and then remove PCB 4-2 from the front panel 4.
40. Unscrew the screws on part 4-3, and then remove part 4-3 from the front panel 4.
41. Unscrew the screws on PCB 4-4, and then remove PCB 4-4 from the front panel 4.
42. Remove film 4-5 from the front panel 4.
43. Remove EMI finger 4-6 from the front panel 4.
44. Remove film 5-1 from the front panel 5.
45. Remove EMI finger 5-2 from the front panel 5.
46. Unscrew the screws on air filter 7-1, and then remove air filter 7-1 from the plastic panel 7.
47. Unscrew the screws on hinge 7-2, and then remove hinge 7-2 from the plastic panel 7.
48. Unscrew the screws on part 11-1, and then remove part 11-1 from the cable management bracket 11.
49. Unscrew the screws on part 11-2, and then remove part 11-2 from the cable management bracket 11.
50. Unscrew the screws on part 11-3, and then remove part 11-3 from the cable management bracket 11.
51. Unscrew the screws on part 14-1, and then remove part 14-1 from PMU 14.
52. Remove the inner cable from PMU 14.
53. Unscrew the screws on PCB 14-2, and then remove PCB 14-2 from PMU 14.
54. Remove part 14-3 from PMU 14.
55. Remove film 14-4 from PMU 14.
56. Unscrew the screws on part 17-1, and then remove part 17-1 from power cable holder 17.
57. Unscrew the screws on part 17-2, and then remove part 17-2 from power cable holder 17.
58. Unscrew the screws on part 18-1, and then remove part 18-1 from the PEM 18.
59. Disconnect the inner cable 18-2 from plug receptacle 18-4.
60. Unscrew the screws on panel 18-3, and then remove panel 18-3 from the PEM 18.
61. Unscrew the screws on plug receptacle 18-4, and then remove plug receptacle 18-4 from the panel 18-3.
62. Unscrew the screws on inner cable 18-2, and then remove inner cable 18-2 from the part 18-6.
63. Unscrew the screws on part 18-5, and then remove part 18-5 from the part 18-6.
64. Unscrew the screws on protection cover 20-1, and then remove protection cover 20-1 from the fan tray 20.
65. Unscrew the screws on protection cover 20-2, and then remove protection cover 20-2 from the fan tray 20.
66. Unscrew the screws on fan 20-3, and then remove fan 20-3 from the fan tray 20.
67. Unscrew the screws on PCB 20-4, and then remove PCB 20-4 from the fan tray 20.
68. Remove film 20-5 from the fan tray 20.
69. Remove EMI finger 20-6 from the fan tray 20.
70. Unscrew the screws on PCB 21-1, and then remove PCB 21-1 from the panel 21.
71. Remove film 21-2 from the panel 21.
72. Remove EMI finger 21-3 from the panel 21.
73. Remove film 22-1 from the panel 22.
74. Remove EMI finger 21-2 from the panel 22.
75. Unscrew the screws on top cover 16-1, and then remove top cover 16-1 from the power shelf 16.
76. Remove switch cable from the rocker switch 16-8.
77. Unscrew the screws on rear cover 16-2, and then remove rear cover 16-2 from the power shelf 16.
78. Unscrew the screws on bracket 16-3, and then remove bracket 16-3 from the power shelf 16.
79. Unscrew the screws on PCB 16-4, and then remove PCB 16-4 from the bracket 16-3.
80. Unscrew the screws on conflux plate 16-5, and then remove conflux plate 16-5 from the bracket 16-3.
81. Unscrew the screws on PCB 16-6, and then remove PCB 16-6 from the bracket 16-3.
82. Remove insulation pad 16-7 from the bracket 16-3.
83. Remove rocker switch 16-8 from the power shelf 16.
84. Unscrew the screws on handle 16-9, and then remove handle 16-9 from the power shelf 16.

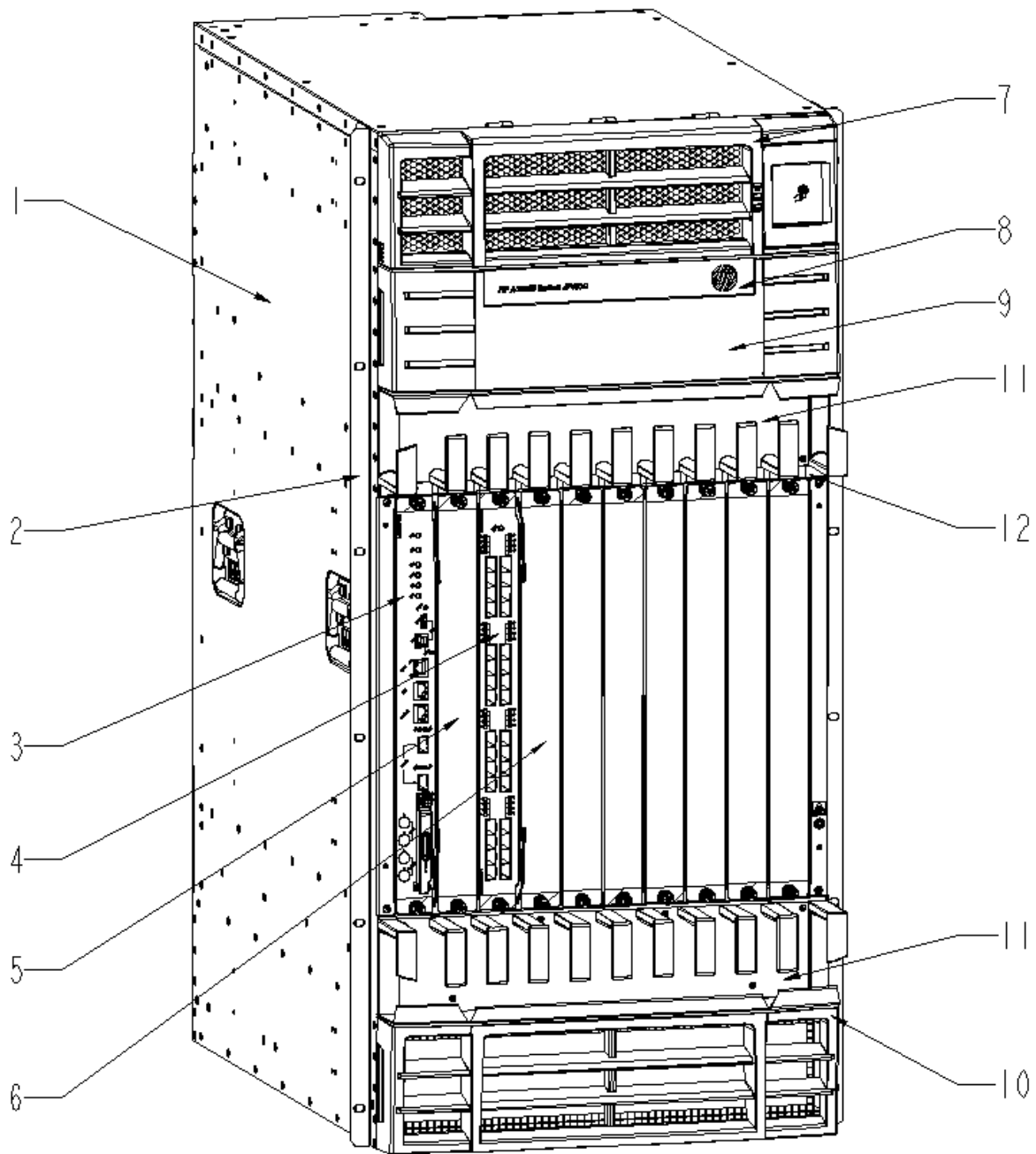


Figure 1 Treatments to the product (front view)

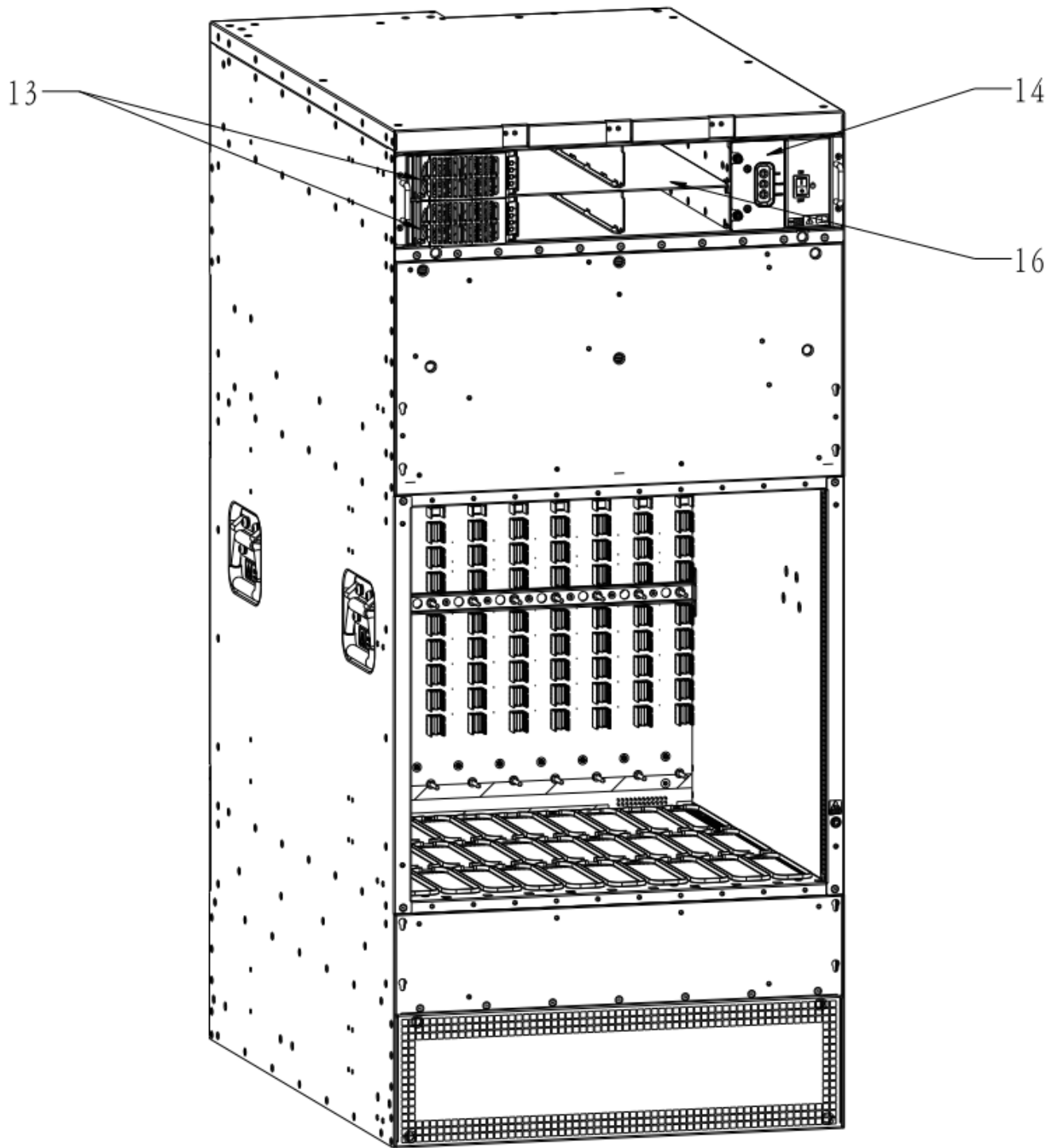


Figure 2 Remove PMU and PSU (front view)

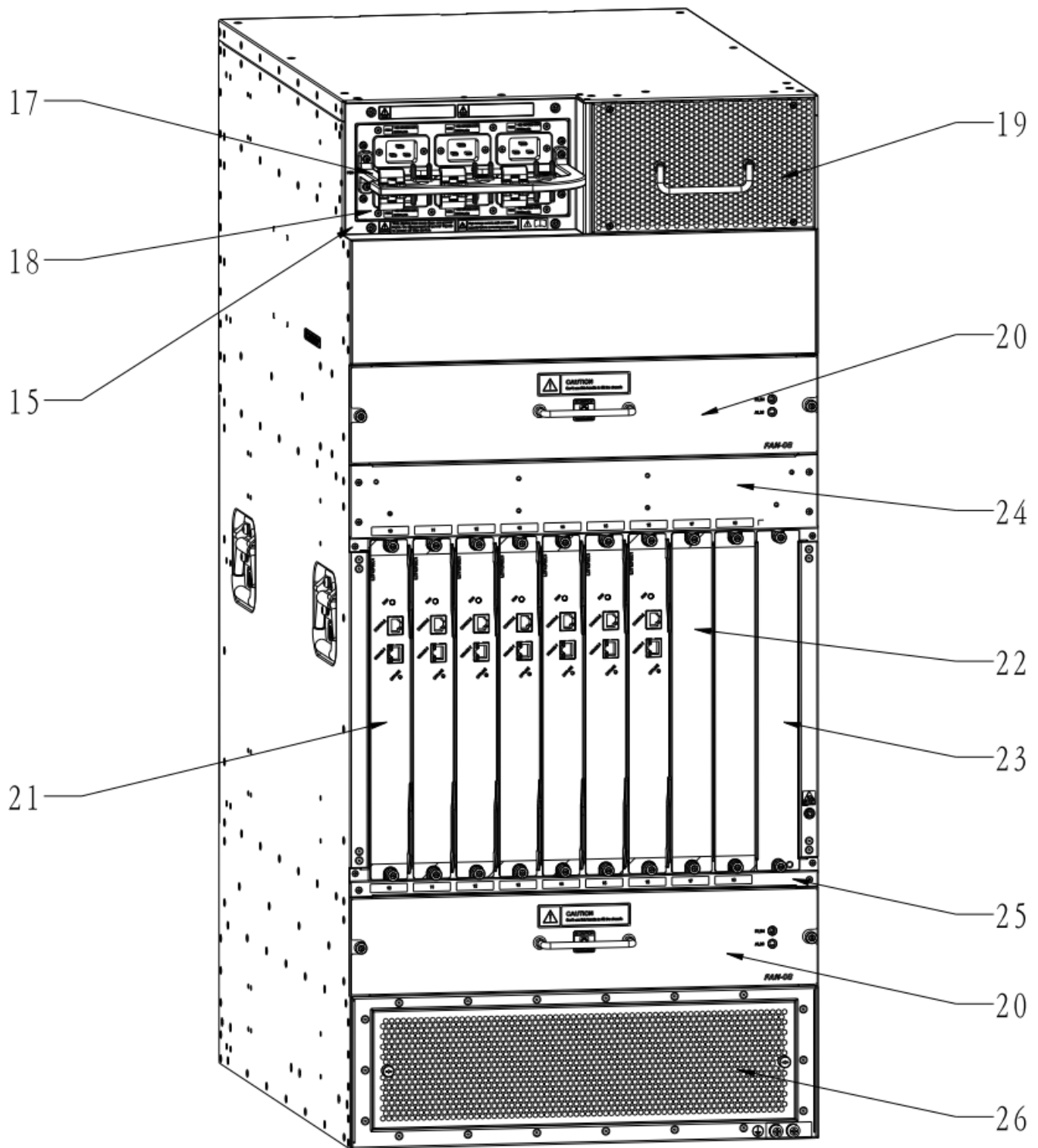


Figure 3 Treatments to the product (rear view)

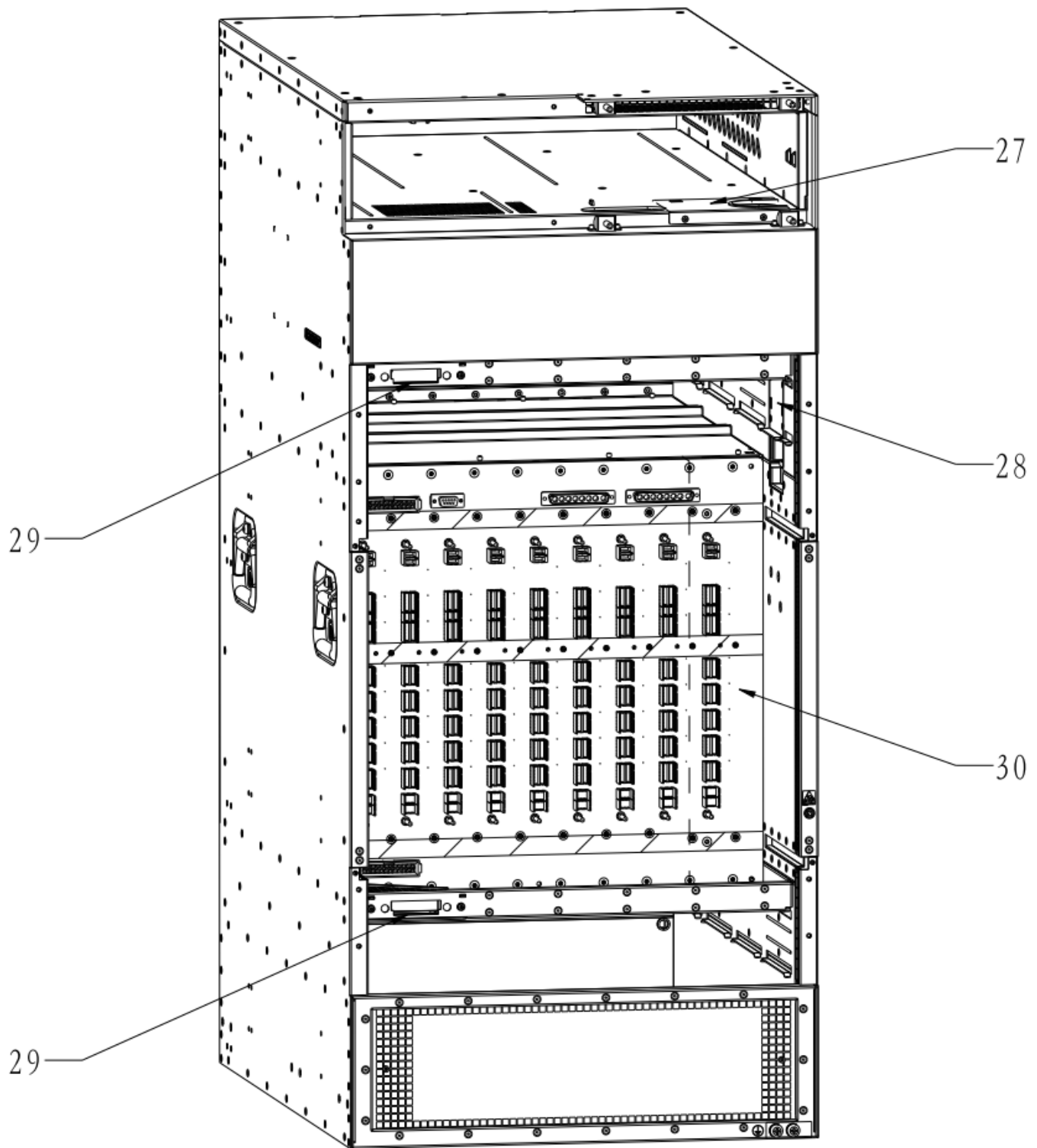


Figure 4 Remove the backboard (rear view)

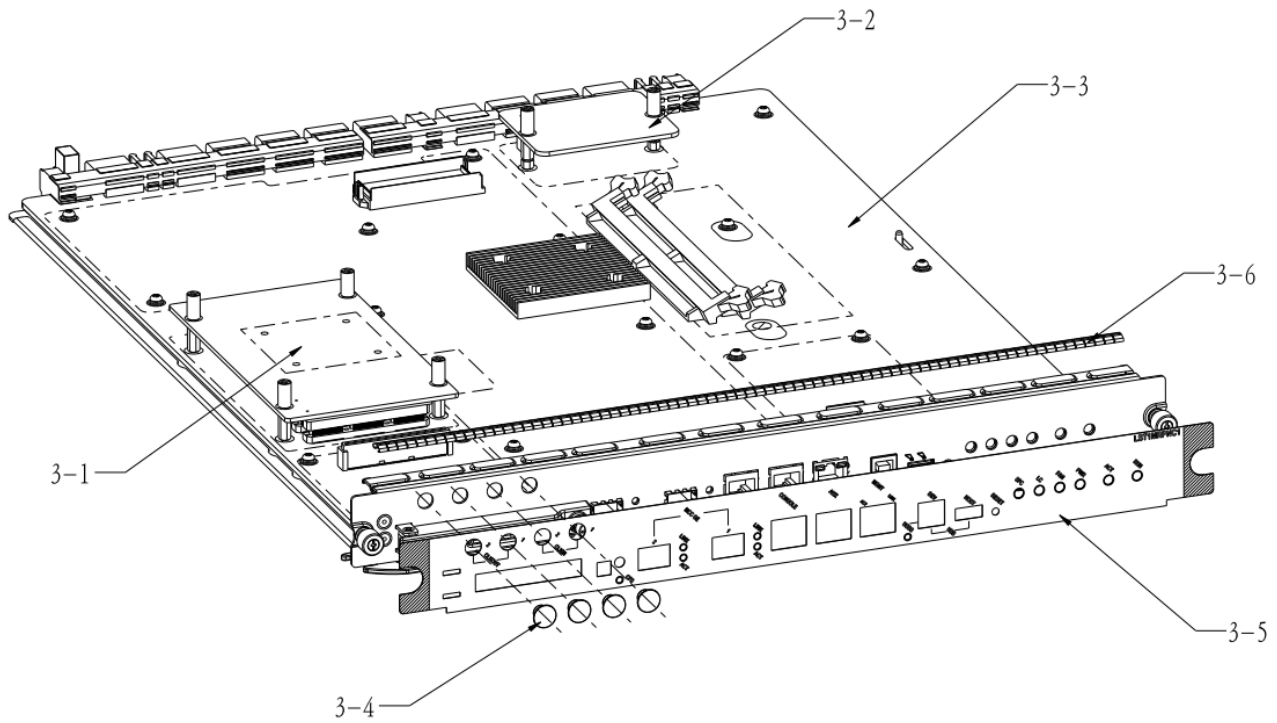


Figure 5 Treatments to front panel 3

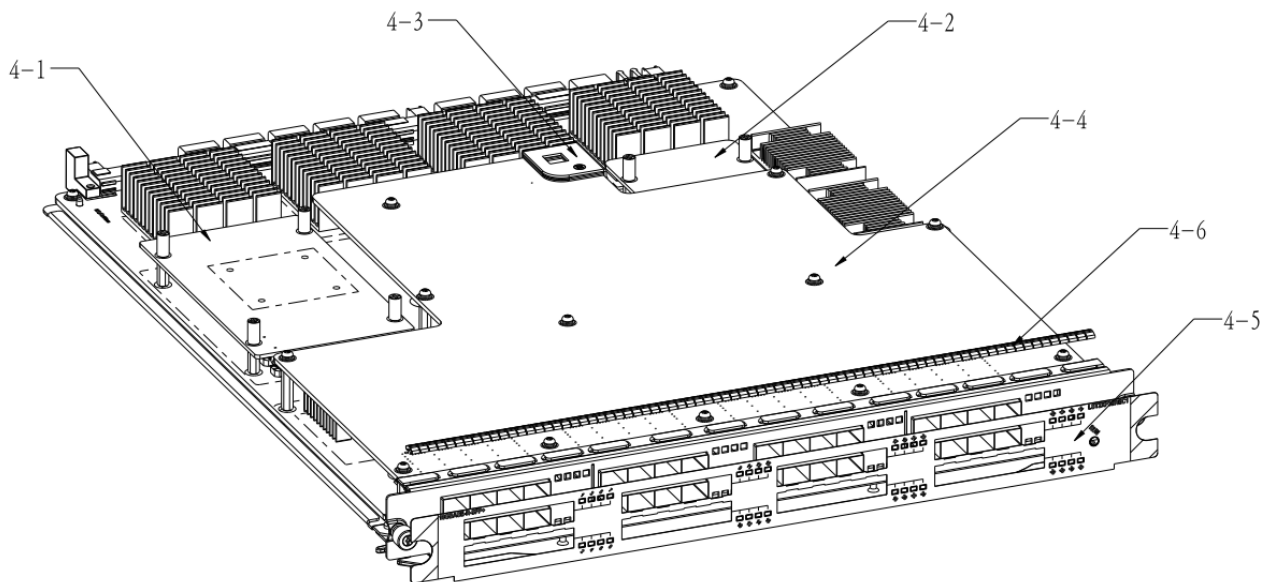


Figure 6 Treatments to front panel 4

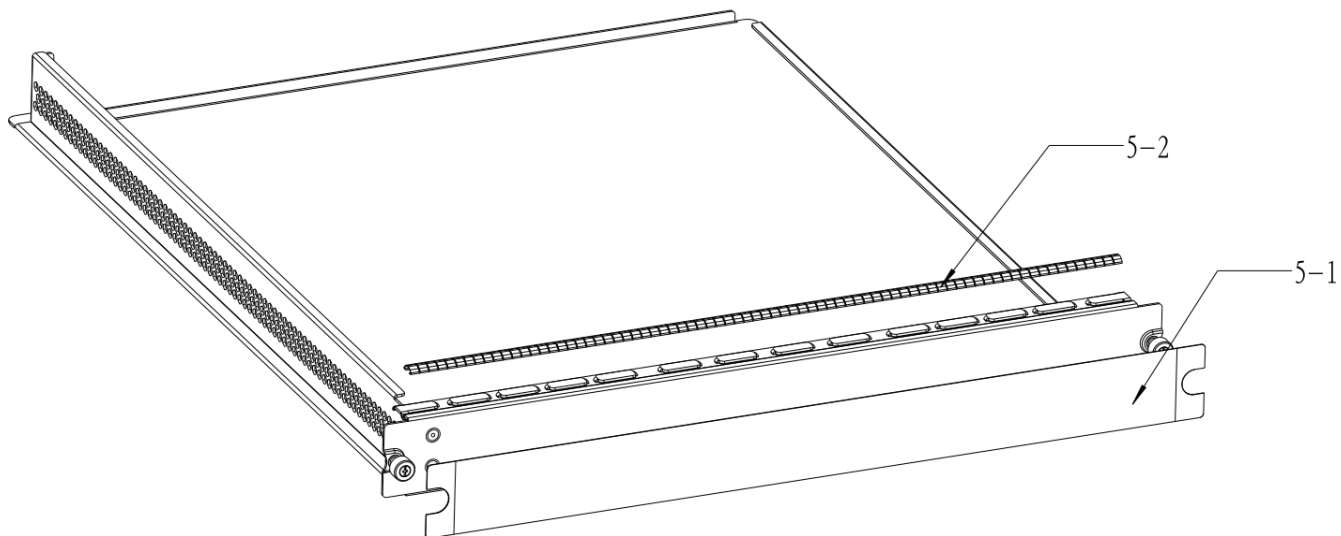


Figure 7 Treatments to front panel 5

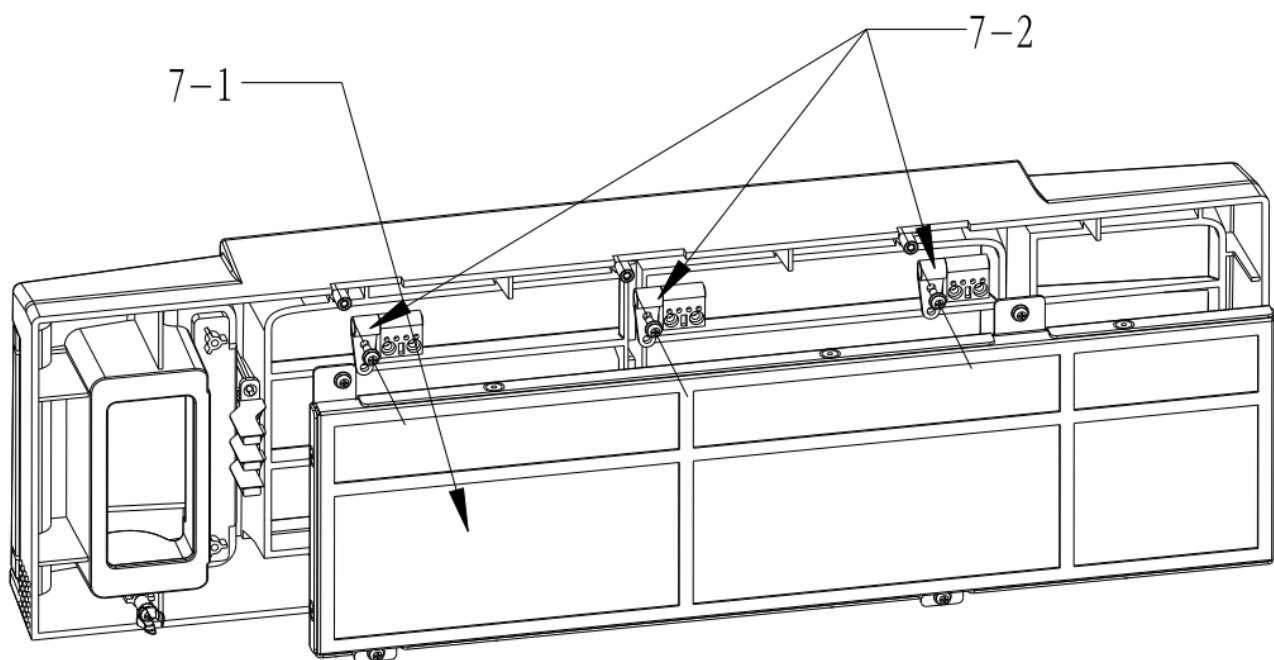


Figure 8 Treatments to plastic panel 7

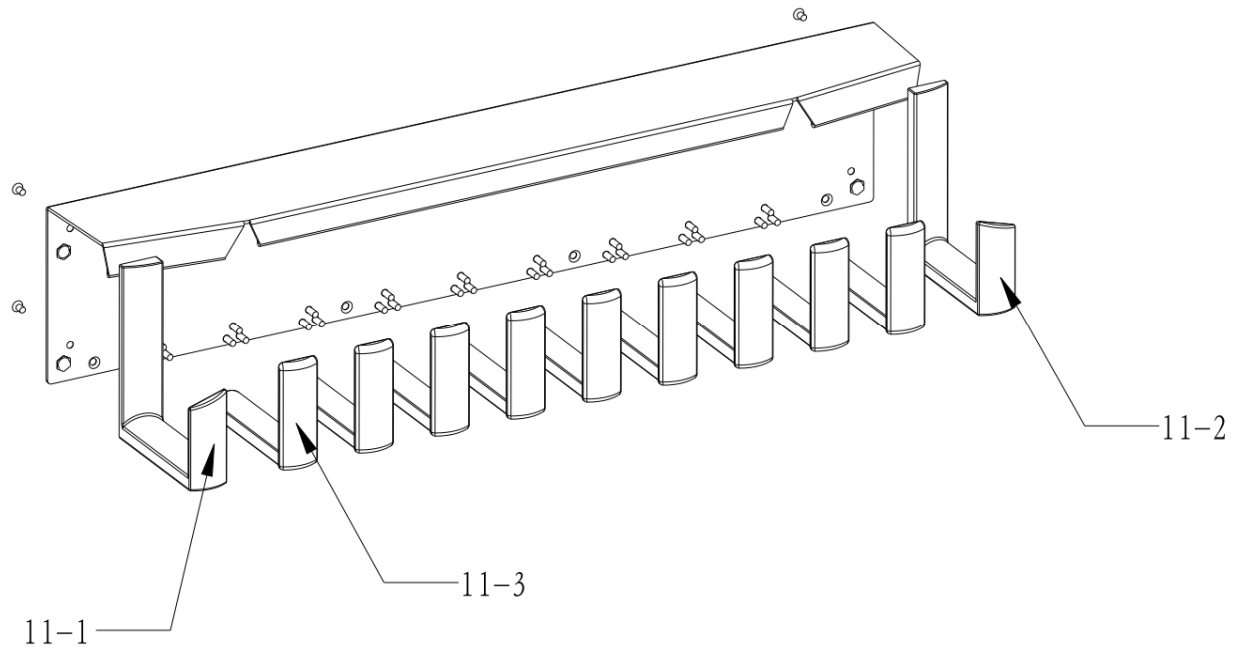


Figure 9 Treatments to cable management bracket 11

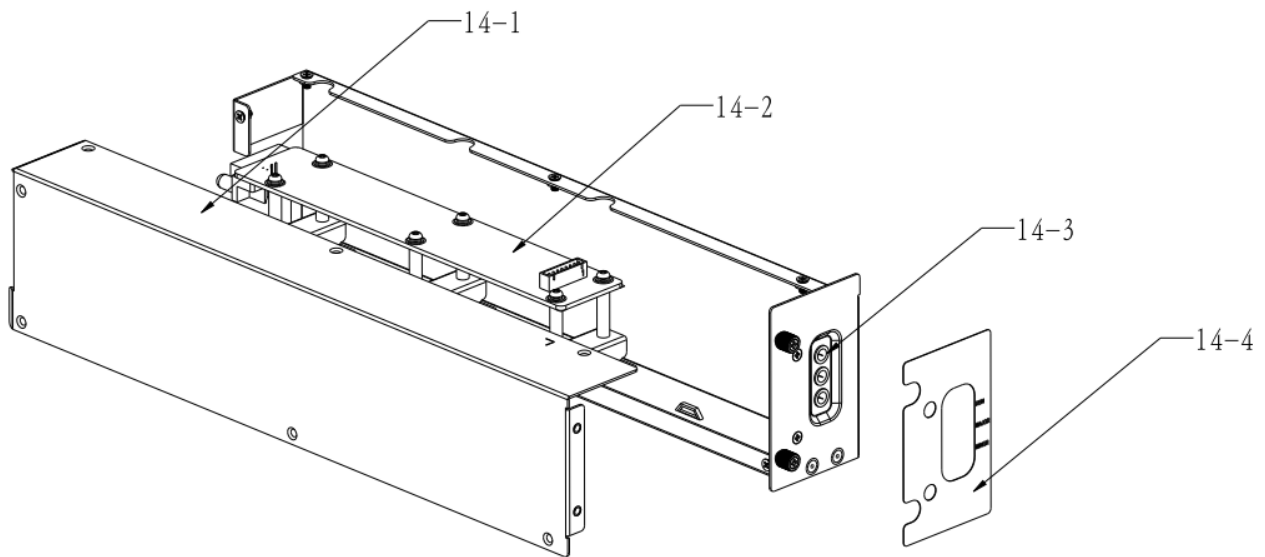


Figure 10 Treatments to PMU 14

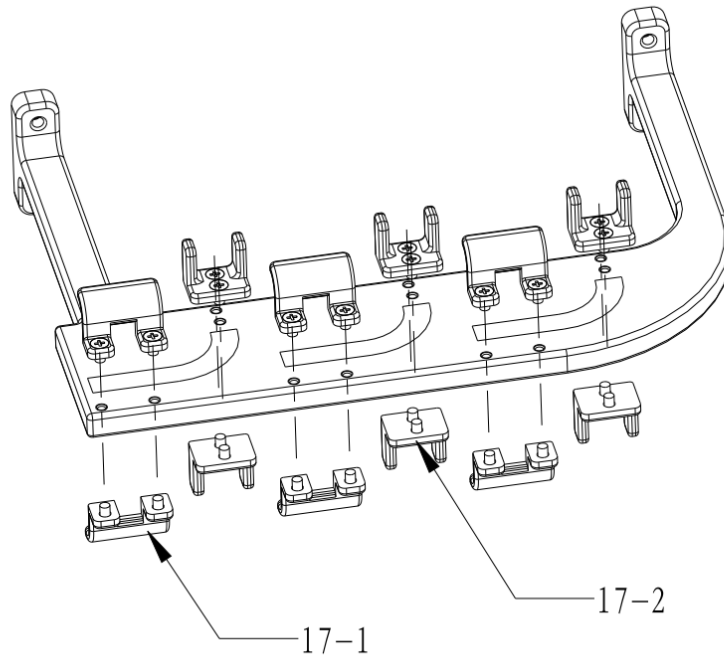


Figure 11 Treatments to power cable holder 17

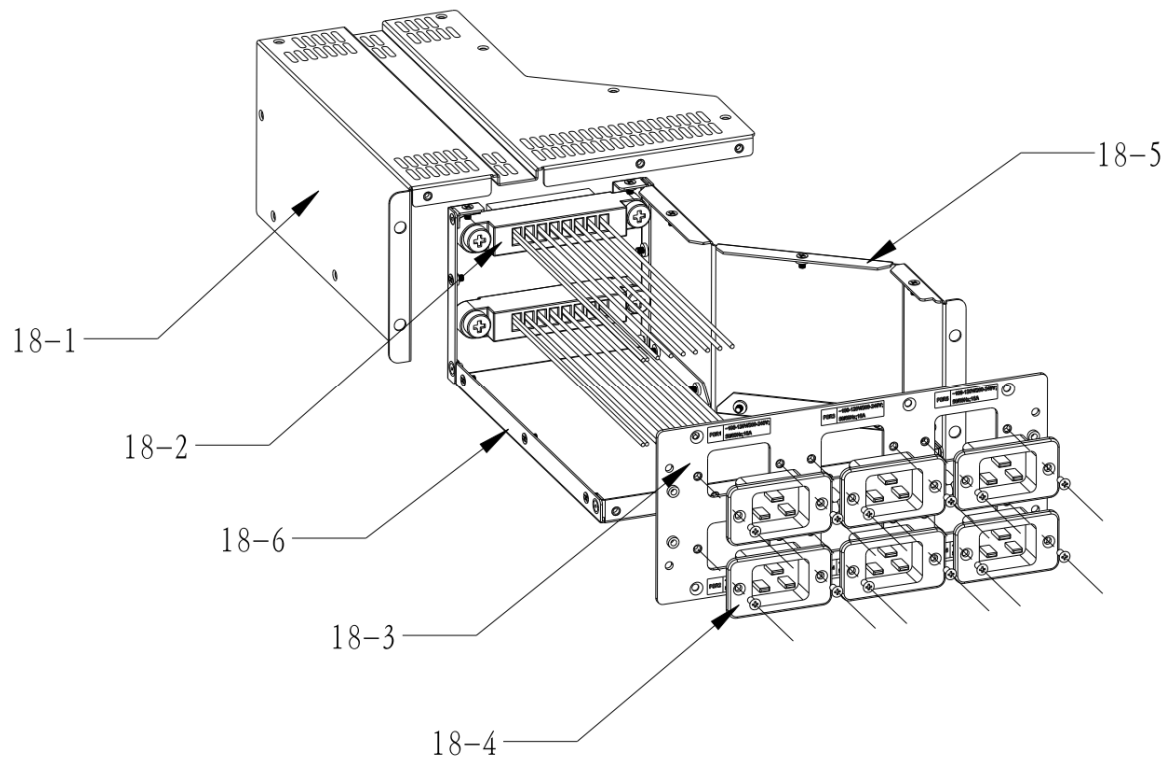


Figure 12 Treatments to PEM 18

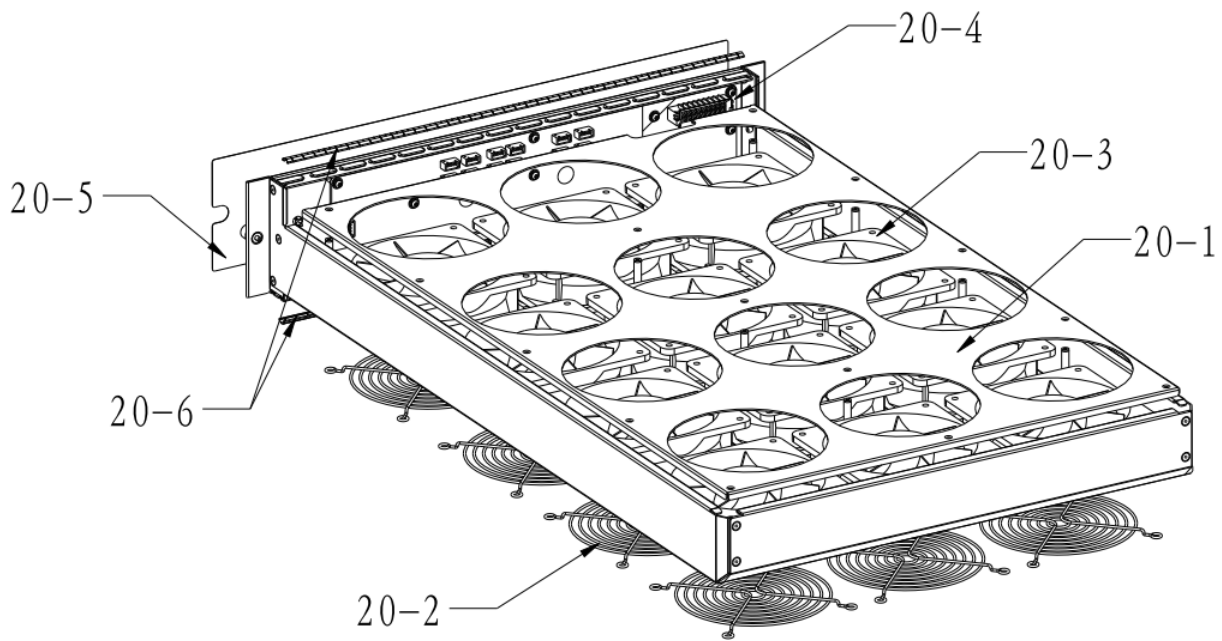


Figure 13 Treatments to Fan Tray 12

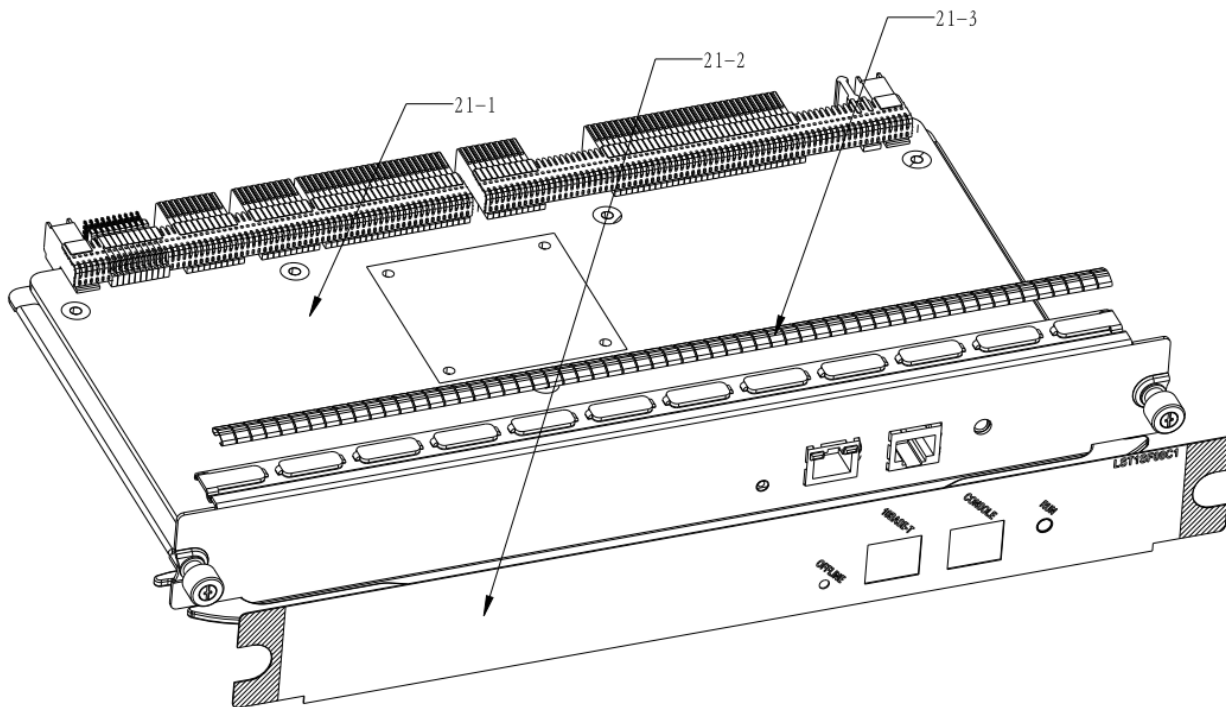


Figure 14 Treatments to panel 21

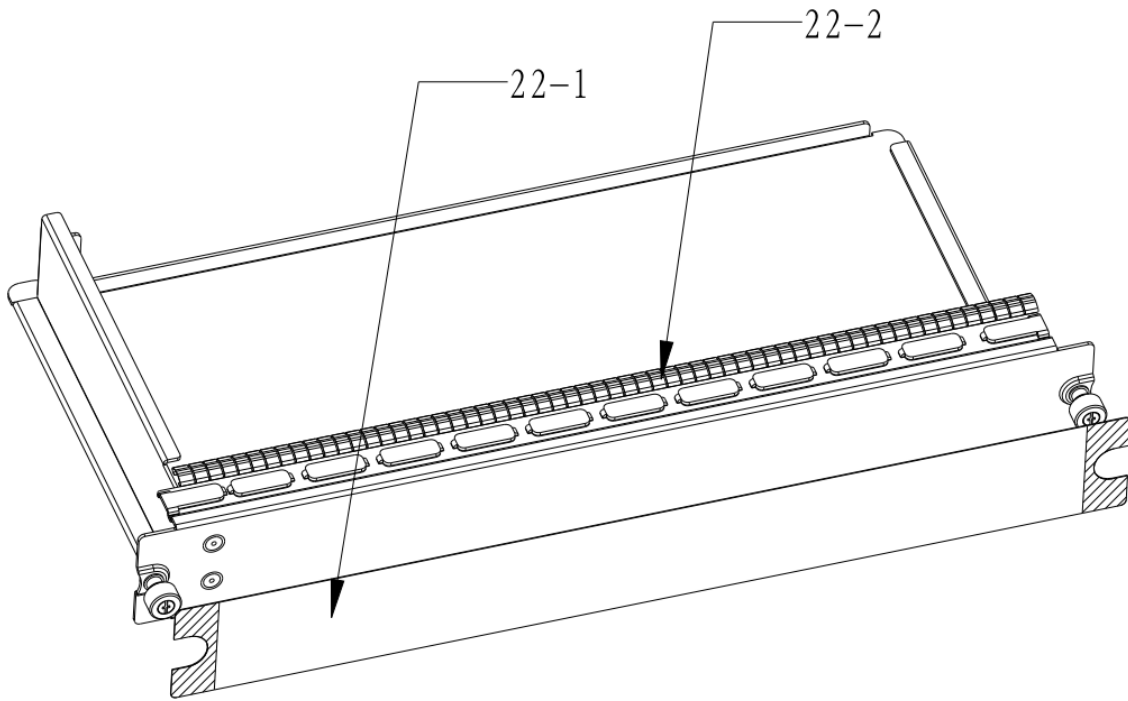


Figure 15 Treatments to panel 22

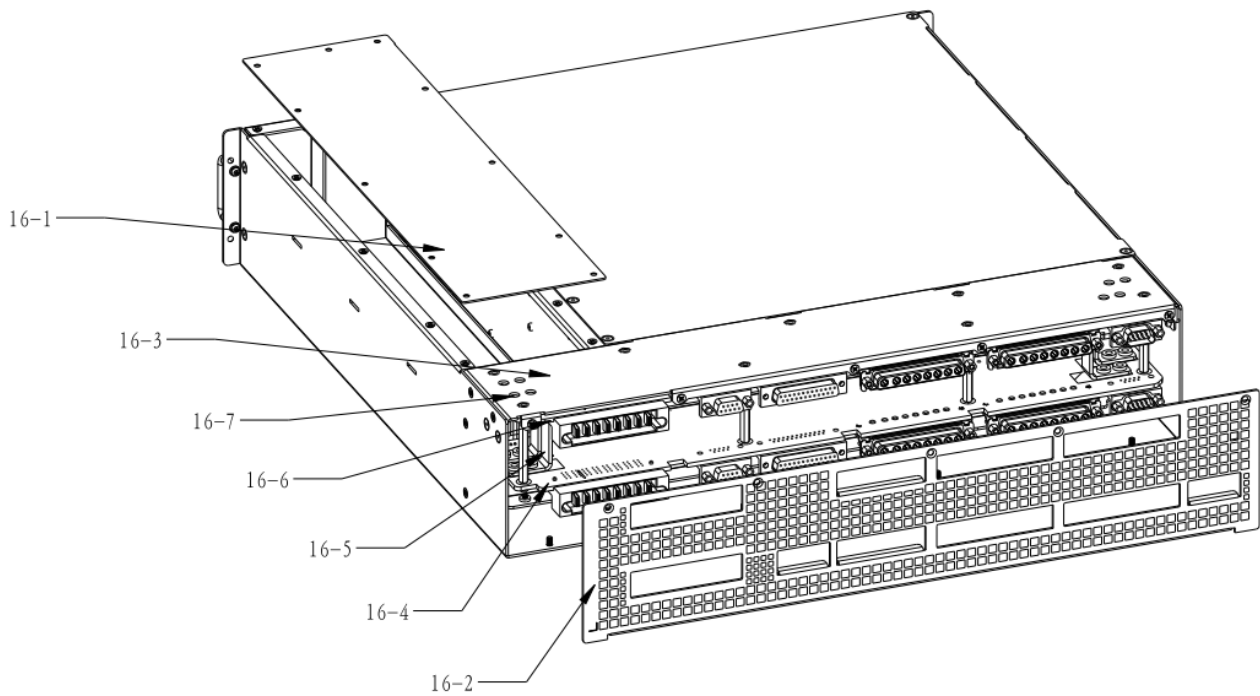


Figure 16 Treatments to power shelf 16 (rear view)

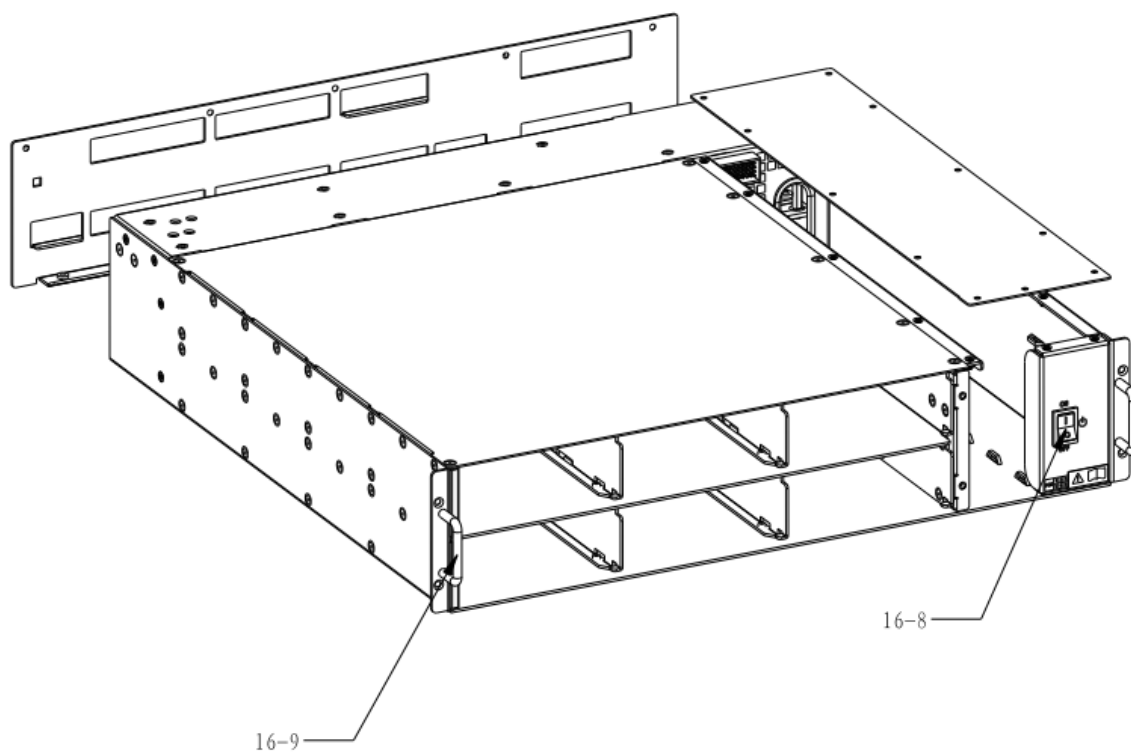


Figure 17 Treatments to power shelf 16 (front view)
