Purpose: The document is intended for use by end-of-life recyclers or treatment facilities. It provides the basic instructions for the disassembly of HP products to remove components and materials requiring selective treatment, as defined by EU directive 2002/96/EC, Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE).

1.0 Items Requiring Selective Treatment

1.1 Items listed below are classified as requiring selective treatment.

3.0 Product Disassembly Process

3.1 List the basic steps that should typically be followed to remove components and materials requiring selective treatment:

1. Remove mounting brackets or shelves when present
2. Remove top cover
3. Cut tie wrap when present as required
4. Capacitors > 2.5CM – With #2 Philips screw driver remove the screws securing the top cover. Locate the P/S then locate the capacitors and pry from the PCB with a medium flat head screw driver and dispose of properly.
